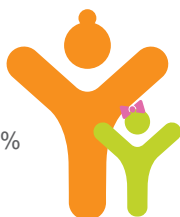

Successes & Progress

All that kids can be

Community involvement

- 668 children and youth received mentorship and 82% of them reported feeling supported by their mentor.



Emotional and physical well-being

- 317 children and youth participated in after school programs and 85% of them were observed as being healthier and more active.

Engagement in learning

- 229 children and youth with learning disabilities received individual tutoring and 90% of them have gained learning strategies to use in school.

Poverty to possibility

Employment and financial security

- 71 financial literacy workshops were delivered and upon completion 78% of 32 participants reported a positive change in the way they handle their finances.

Food security

- 256,574 meals were consumed by families and individuals who may have gone without.



Housing stability

- 123 individuals received one-on-one support including, personal goal setting and counseling and 85% of them were successful in achieving the goals they set out.

Building strong communities

Community engagement

- 265 individuals with special needs participated in social and recreational programs, overall participants felt an increased sense of belonging.

Connected to supports

- 293 individuals who received counseling said they experienced an improvement in social interest and independence.

Personal well-being and safety

- 141 individuals who live with mental health issues participated in recreational programming and 90% of them demonstrated an increased sense of positive well-being.

In August 2016, United Way of Saskatoon and Area, along with Greater Saskatoon Catholic Schools, Saskatoon Public Schools and other community partners will launch four United Way Summer Success programs focused on enhancing children's literacy and language acquisition.

United Way of Saskatoon and Area invests time, knowledge and resources locally to help kids be all that they can be, move people from poverty to possibility and build strong communities.

In 2015 we invested over \$5.2 million into our community in order to move our mission forward and achieve outcomes in our three focus areas.

**United Way of Saskatoon and Area received \$800,000 in designated donations which were distributed to other registered charities.*

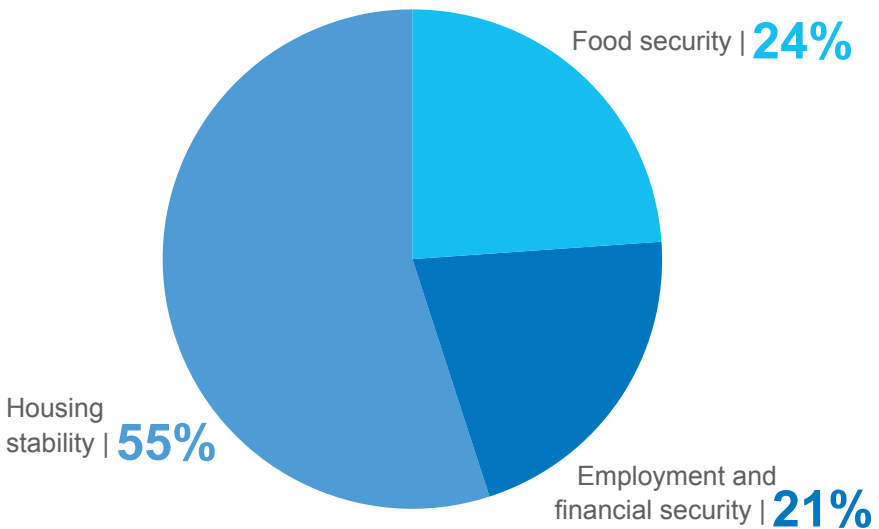
Moving people from poverty to possibility

Journey Home

In April 2014, United Way of Saskatoon and Area contracted Saskatoon Crisis Intervention Service to deliver Journey Home, a Housing First program in Saskatoon. This United Way program focuses on Saskatoon's most vulnerable citizens and those that have been chronically homeless. As of April 2016, 41 individuals have been housed.

It is our mission to improve lives and build community by engaging individuals and mobilizing collective action.

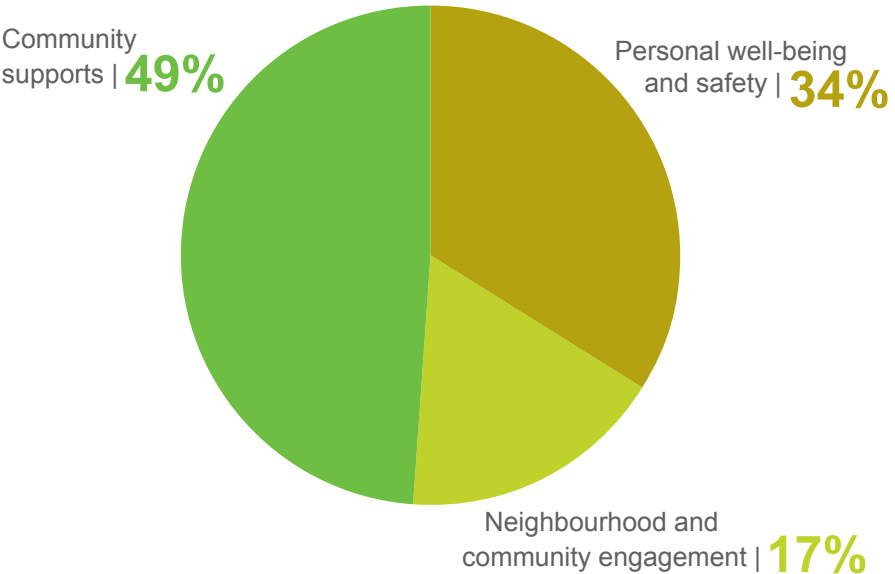
